## **Daniel A. Ward DVM, PhD, DACVO**

Professor

Small Animal Ophthalmology

Small Animal Clinical Sciences

Dr. Ward was born and raised Memphis, Tennessee. Undergraduate studies were accomplished at Christian Brothers College and Middle Tennessee State University. He attended veterinary school at the University of Tennessee, after which he spent time in private small animal practice in Greenville SC. He did his ophthalmology residency, doctoral studies in pharmacology and post doc in clinical pharmacology at the University of Georgia.

He joined the University of Tennessee faculty in 1990. His primary academic interest lies in teaching students and residents. He has also been actively involved in academic development of junior faculty, having spent over 10 years on the college's Promotion and Tenure committee.

His basic research is in the area of ocular pharmacology, especially as it pertains to control of the blood-ocular barriers and aqueous humor dynamics. Fluorophotometry is our primary research tool for investigating both areas. Clinical research interests are glaucoma, ocular trauma, and equine ophthalmology.
